

#1 This is a good starting hole. Not real long with a fairway that narrows and has a cross bunker that the player must avoid. Recommend a fairway wood off the tee which will leave a short to mid-iron to the green. This is a safe play as there is water right of the fairway and out of bounds left of the fairway.

#2 Rated the most difficult hole on the course number 2 introduces you to the burns that signify The Links at Summerly. Played properly can be an easy par if you don't get greedy. Off the tee a fairway wood will leave you short of the first burn. The second shot would require a similar play as there is another burn in front of the green. This will leave you with a short iron to the green.

#3 The third hole is only 160 yards from the back tee with room for error off the tee. This hole usually plays a club longer than the yardage and with a large green one must pay attention to pin location.

#4 Go ahead and take the head cover off the driver. Straight away par 4 but, must hit straight off the tee. Second shot into a large well undulated green.

#5 Great hole! A bunker strategically placed in the landing area that covers the right side of the fairway off the tee. The big hitters can carry the bunker and be awarded with approximately 30 more yards of roll as the fairway slopes toward the green leaving the player with a short iron to a double green. Those players that can't carry the bunker will need to favor the left side of the fairway leaving a little longer of a second shot to the green.

#6 The par 5 sixth hole is 522 yards from the back and 469 from the white. The long hitters can reach this hole in two, but must carry the ball to the green as there is another burn running across the fairway in front of the green. The shorter

hitters need to lay up just short of the burn using one less club than yardage indicates due to roll of fairway.

#7 Have some fun with this hole. The seventh hole is a very short but tricky hole. This is actually a drivable par 4 with a risk reward factor due to the burn that runs diagonally in front of the green. For the players who choose to lay up favor the right side of the fairway as the green opens up from there.

#8 The par 4, 447 yard eighth hole is probably one of the toughest holes on the front nine. Three bunkers guard the left side of the fairway and a burn that may catch the second shot of the shorter hitters. A good drive still requires a long iron to a long narrow green with a waste bunker right of the green. Take bogey and move on.

#9 Toughest par 3 of the five on the golf course. Playing 248 from the back the hole is protected with a waste bunker along the right side of the leading into water that protects the right and backside of the green. The high handicapper can bail out to the left and hit just short and left of the green.

#10 The first of three difficult par 5's on the back nine. Can't see the fairway from the tee, but can see the waste bunker that runs down the left side of the fairway. Best shot is over the right edge of the waste bunker as ball will funnel to the center of the fairway. Again, second shot is risk reward as a burn crosses the fairway approximately 75 yards from the green which is protected by a lake 30 yards in front of the green on the left side and runs around to the back of a slightly elevated green.

#11 Fairly simple. Just be sure to hit enough club to reach the center of the green. If you leave it short it makes for a challenging chip shot. Fescues protect the right side of the hole.

#12 The par 4, twelfth hole is a slight dog leg left with bunkers along the left side of the fairway and another bunker positioned in the landing area. A fairway wood off the tee may be the play for the better golfer, but too far right and you could end up swimming. Second shot is across water to an elevated green that one must carry. Many hazards on this hole makes it one of the prettiest holes on the golf course.

#13 Double dog leg! Definitely play this hole as designed. Try and short cut this hole and you will most likely be adding two strokes to your score. Favor the left side of the fairway off the tee as burn runs diagonally across fairway. Room to spare on your second shot that prepares for a third shot over a big bunker in front of the green.

#14 Short par 3 to a big double green shared with hole number 5. Make sure you fly it to the pin as you know what runs in front of the green.

#15 A medium length par 4 with two big bunkers on the right and a bigger waste bunker down the left side. The fairway slopes from right to left with the two bunkers on the right as the top of the mound. In front of the green is a burn and 3 bunkers behind the green. The green is shaped into a T, middle of the green approach shot is recommended for any pin location. A birdie here will set up the next 3 holes to be safe.

#16 One of the Longer par 3's with 4 bunkers surrounding the green. This a big green and slopes from front to back and right to left. The best shot is just on the front of the green and let it roll back to whatever pin location. Be careful not to go to far over the green because there is a waste bunker waiting to collect balls.

#17 One of our longest par 4's on the course. There is a burn running down the left side and a big bunker on the left in the fairway. Most players can carry or roll past the bunker on the right side. The next shot is a long iron or hybrid into the green with bunkers on the right side and all on the left and backside of the green. The Green is long from front to back and slopes back to front which makes it easier to hold longer rolling shots. Par is a good score.

#18 The Longest hole on the course. It's a tough driving hole with a set of bunkers short right to catch all sliced shots with the last bunker having a 6 foot face. On the left are two bunkers on a mound for the long ball hitters. Down the left side is an environmentally sensitive hazard and down the right is a rock river. The second shot is a risk reward with a burn 120 yards in front of the green, take advantage of the downhill slope after the set of bunkers in the fairway to the burn. There is a bunker 15 yards in front of the green to catch mis-hit shots from the long hitters as well as two bunkers on the right of the fairway after the burn.
